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Student Goals and Standards

The GOALS of Windward Islands School of Evangelism are high:

YOU - to provide you with the inspiration and tools upon which to build your life as a Christian

THE CHURCH - to provide leaders for churches in the Caribbean region who are scripturally and morally above reproach

THE COMMUNITY - to witness to and win souls in Barbados

The STANDARDS for its students must be high, too!

YOU must be dedicated and willing to take these high goals as your own, often sacrificing personal comforts and desires.

1. Study hours - as assigned and AS NEEDED
2. Curfew: Dark, except for School and School-approved functions.
3. All absences from campus must be reported to responsible authority.
4. Relationships which might interfere and affect any or all of the students (especially male/female relationships) will be carefully monitored. More than one hour daily of association between individual male/female students will be considered excessive and faculty will rule in all cases as to the ability for one or both students to meet the goals of the School under these conditions.

Men may not enter women's dorm rooms, and women may not enter men's dorm rooms.

5. Attitudes reveal to others much about the "inner man." Consistent bad attitudes will require counseling to determine further action. Attitudes "wear off" on others, and undermine the stability and commitment of other students.

THE CHURCH needs leaders who study the Scriptures and APPLY them to their lives as an example. It is an important part of your education to BEGIN now. This is especially true as we discipline ourselves to live together in harmony and Christian love.

1. Consideration for others in study and work is very important. Can you sacrifice your radio for your roommate who does not study well with it on? Do you do your share WILLINGLY and ON TIME?

2. Facilities: God has given us fine facilities to use for the School. It is only reasonable that we should thank HIM daily by taking care not to damage, lose or destroy them. Cleanliness of physical surroundings often indicates the state of our life; regular and complete cleaning is important!
3. Your food, as well as your tuition, is provided on a work-study basis; students contribute to the work of the School through duties of shopping, food preparation, and cleaning. God has provided this, therefore you should glorify Him through it also, using it wisely to fortify your bodies physically for His work.

THE COMMUNITY needs the witness of Christian young people. The very first responsibility is to show ourselves as a harmonious, loving and considerate group of Christians.

NO School business discussed IN ANY WAY with other than School personnel!

LIMIT your use of private community homes for personal reasons - for example, phone calls are to be made from the School telephone only, and then only for business unless permission is given otherwise. The same is true with television. CONSIDER WHAT IS REALLY IMPORTANT AT THIS TIME!

REMEMBER that right actions can be completely wrong if ATTITUDES, APPEARANCES AND MOTIVES are not right. We will be judged by the community on these, as much or more than on actions themselves.

It is the desire of the Faculty of WISE that our students have few "rules" imposed upon them. However, be reminded that Christian character is the only acceptable standard, and Faculty has the right and responsibility to determine when and if such has been violated, and any resulting discipline.

We trust that God has led you to WISE, and that He will guide you to meet HIS high standards, the basis for these rules and the whole purpose of Windward Islands School of Evangelism.
