commented on the bad road which prevented them from visiting our campus. Thankfully we were able to engage a local company to fix the road, which was done in March, and now we are enjoying a vastly improved situation!





Vehicle Search

Speaking of roads, WISE has been able to secure a new vehicle (not "new" but new to us). Two of our vehicles, which have been used for many years to provide daily transportation for staff and students have pretty much reached the end of the road. One is 20 years old, and the other 13. We very much needed an upgrade to more reliable transportation. We have been blessed to acquire a small van from a rental car company which is slightly larger than our other vehicles. It can seat up to eight people and provide us with greater flexibility for cargo. These arrangements are being finalized as this is written. The price of vehicles in Barbados is even higher than in the US, but we feel the \$25,000 US price for this one is not bad at all.
