

## A WONDERFUL CARIBBEAN LEADERS' CONFERENCE!

WISE hosted a Caribbean Leaders' Conference from October 24-26. People attended from six different countries: Antigua, Barbados, Guyana, Jamaica, St. Vincent, and the United States. We had 19 overseas guests, in addition to local folks who attended various parts of the Conference.

Our theme was **Restoration**. Our goal was simple: to offer refreshment and encouragement to leaders who have gone through a very challenging season in ministry. We wanted to provide a chance to get together with other leaders, share experiences and ideas, fellowship together, and participate in worship sessions and workshops designed to inspire and instruct. We wanted to encourage a renewed passion for ministry so that leaders would continue and not give up. And we wanted to provide practical help for post-covid ministry, which is why we had workshops on everything from "Restoring the Effective Use of Technology in the Church" to "Restoring Mental Health Among God's

People" to "Restoring Pastors' Wives After a Difficult Season" to "Restoring Sunday School After Covid," among others.

By all accounts, the Conference achieved its aims. Our presenters gave excellent content. But perhaps the most impressive thing was how from the start our guests were talking and laughing and reminiscing together (a number of them were WISE graduates and/or knew each other from ministry over the years). They "ate up" the chance just to be together and visit with one another, as if they were very hungry for such an opportunity. Not to mention literally "eating up" the delicious meals provided!

A secondary objective, of course, was to further recruitment efforts for WISE. We felt the school would sell itself if people were here to see it, and indeed, several ministers went away talking about going back home and encouraging people they know to come to WISE. We must continue to pray for the fruit that is yet to be seen, but we believe it will come, not only in new students for WISE, but in renewed efforts among the leaders to partner together for the sake of God's kingdom in the Caribbean.
